The BEAM TEAM is Going

We thank the Lord that the BEAM quartet returned safely from their 4,500 mile trip, sharing the BEAM ministry in churches in north-central Alaska. The boys were well received and helped to create an awareness of the ministry the Lord has given our family to reach remote regions with the Gospel. They sang and presented the work in 10 churches, preaching in many of them. One of these churches has already taken BEAM, our Gospel delivery ministry, on for support. Thank you, Old Paths Baptist Church. This means we can reach out even farther in remote regions with the Gospel. I believe all the churches they were in would have the boys come back in the future, as they were a blessing wherever they went. Praise the Lord for the fruitful ministry of the quartet of our four oldest boys: Paul, Johnathan, Daniel, and Gregory.

Evangelistic Meetings Held

We thank the Lord for the good evangelistic meetings held in the villages of Watson Lake, Yukon, Canada and Kitwanga, BC. These meetings were part of our summer circuit outreach to communities without any good Gospel preaching churches in them. The two nearest Baptist churches to the north of us are in Whitehorse, Canada (700 miles from us) and Haines, AK (900 miles from us). There are no other works between us. This is where God has called us to go.

Two Saved at Watson Lake!

In Watson Lake, a community about 400 miles from us, we held day meetings in the park which were designed to reach the children, and



evening meetings for the adults. On the last day of the meeting, a couple from Germany got saved.

A total of 10 people attended the meetings in addition to our family of 15. Three of the people who came were our friends from Whitehorse, Yukon, Canada. Bro. Harrison (who brought two preacher boys with him) is a missionary pastor who has also done some work in Watson Lake and hopes to start a church there. At first, we did not see a great deal of response in this outreach, but God blessed our efforts with two people being saved. To God be the glory!

Kitwanga had 14 total Visitors

After our Watson Lake trip, our family held a three-day meeting in Kitwanga, BC. This was the first time we held meetings in this mostly Native community. Kitwanga is a remote village almost 130 miles from our home. God brought in a total of 14 visitors to this meeting from the village. Most of these people were non-Native although

Kitwanga is mostly a Native community. With our family, we had a high attendance of 26 people and God met with us each night in the services in a powerful way. In both of the meetings mentioned above, we went out witnessing and visiting each day. We praise the Lord as God honored his Word and our labors in our circuit of activities.



Some Hear The Gospel For The First Time

I just want to mention two people in closing. I had the opportunity to speak

to two young people on separate occasions along the Cassiar highway about 300 miles north of us. These two girls live in very remote places. Their Native cultures are very much in many ways as they have been for centuries, excluding all the modern conveniences they enjoy today. On both occasions, I asked these Native young people if anyone had ever shared the Gospel with them. On both occasions they listened very attentively as they heard God's good news for the very first time. This touched my heart because it refreshes my thoughts as to why God sent us to this place.

Yes, there are many remote places with no church and no one reaching out to the people there. However, God still has a way to reach every kindred, tribe, and tongue. Many places we go may never have a church that stands on its own feet, but we must not wait for everything to be in our favor before we preach the Gospel, or places like these will never be reached. Please continue to pray for our ministry to these places.

Pray We Can Go Through all the Doors God Opens.

There are still many people who must hear the message of salvation; we must tell them. Pray for faithful men that we can disciple who will be able to teach others.

Also pray for our outreach here in Hyder. I recently had the opportunity to witness to a Jewish couple from Israel and a young man from Australia. We have many come from all over the world and the

opportunities to share God's Word are great. I thank the Lord for the opportunities that He has given us.

In Closing, may God bless you where you serve and may this letter encourage you in your missionary outreach to the regions beyond. God bless you in a very special way.
