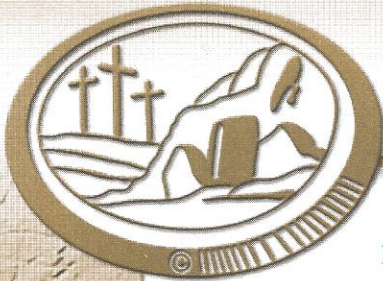

Dear Praying Partners,

It is heartbreaking to see the effects of sin in the lives of the inmates we see every week. When talking to them and dealing with them, I am always reminded that these are common people like you and me – maybe they took sin a step further than we did, or, most likely, the grace of God reached us before we got “caught” in our sins. But, even though I was “*shapen in iniquity, and in sin did my mother conceive me,*” (Ps. 51:5), it’s good to know that God made a way through Jesus Christ that we can have freedom from our sins. What a blessing to be able to share this good news with these folks each week.

I was talking to a man a couple of weeks ago about what sin does to people. He had been saved in prison. As we were talking, he reached down and pulled up his pants leg, then took off a prosthetic leg and laid it to the side. “This is what sin did to me,” he said. He and his son had wrecked a motorcycle while going 150 miles per hour. Praise God, even though he lost a leg, He received a new life in Christ! The son is still not saved – please pray for his eyes to be opened that he might receive this new life as well.

The Lord is blessing, and helped us to be in **7 prisons** since our last letter, and we saw **56 professions of faith**. He allowed me to preach in a couple of missions meetings, to give updates at some of our supporting churches, and to visit a few new churches. We also went to the home office for some training, and were able to spend some time with our grandchildren. Kay continues to go to the jail twice a month for Bible studies with the ladies. She has two ladies from our home church who go with her – one is an older saint who has health problems, but just wants to do something for the Lord, and the other is a middle-aged lady who has been going for about a year. This week, a young lady who just graduated high school went and sang. She is the daughter of a pastor where we had presented the ministry, and had been praying about doing some kind of mission work. She loved going to the jail. She is going to do the lesson next time. Thank the Lord, He uses folks of all ages who will be open and surrendered to doing what He asks them to. It is a blessing to see them excited about winning souls and being a help to the ladies – and it encourages us as well to have their help.

Thank you for your prayers, support, and sacrifice in helping and enabling us to go to the inmates. God bless you.
